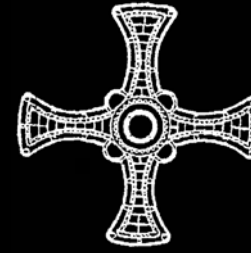

THIRTY THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Sunday 19th November 2006

Today Jesus reminds us that we should always be watchful and so be able to read the signs of the times. He describes a time of cosmic disturbance which will precede his second coming to earth – this time not as a humble babe in an obscure town of a conquered nation, but seen by all, coming in great glory and power in the clouds. We are to wait and watch for such an event because it is the manifestation of Christ's glory to the world.

These words of Jesus will not pass away – all of this will happen. Frightening though the scenario is we can take heart. He promises that he will send his angels to gather his chosen, ourselves, his disciples. We need not fear such a day then, but be secure in the knowledge that it is a sign that Jesus is coming back to restore his sovereignty. It is the final part in the whole history of salvation which Jesus won for us on the cross. Just as the sign of the cross is the symbol of Christianity, so his second coming will be the signal for his final triumph, and his Church, his people, will share in his glory. If we live with this great truth in mind, what a sign of hope we can be for our world.

The community of Maybole was stunned last week to learn of a murder in their town.

Everyone was shocked to hear of the death of Ahmjid Ismail who was working in the family shop in Kirkland Street, and a book of condolence has been opened to allow townspeople to record their sympathy.

The book was opened after the Remembrance Sunday service in the Town Hall and will remain open for the rest of November and then handed to the family. Some have recorded short messages of sympathy and others have simply signed their names. Whatever people are comfortable with, they are invited to add to the book.



Flowers were laid near the shop, prayers were said in local churches, and the family received flowers and many cards as the community rallied round them.

Our parish also sent a letter of sympathy to the Ismail family assuring them of our prayers. May Ahmjid rest in peace.

The great and sad mistake of many people, among them even pious persons, is to imagine that those whom death has taken leave us. They remain! Where are they? In darkness? Oh, no! It is we who are in darkness. We do not see them but they see us. Their eyes, radiant with glory, are fixed upon our eyes full of tears. Oh, infinite consolation! Though invisible to us, our dead are not absent. I have often reflected upon the surest comfort for those who mourn. It is this: a firm faith in the real and continual presence of our loved ones; it is a clear and penetrating conviction that death has not destroyed them, nor carried them away. They are not even absent, but living near to us, transfigured having lost in their glorious change no delicacy of their souls, no tenderness of their hearts, nor especial preference in their affection; on the contrary, having depth and fervour of devotion grown larger a hundredfold. Death is for the good a translation into light, into power, into love. Those who on earth we only ordinary Christians, become perfect; those who were beautiful become good; those who were good become sublime.
