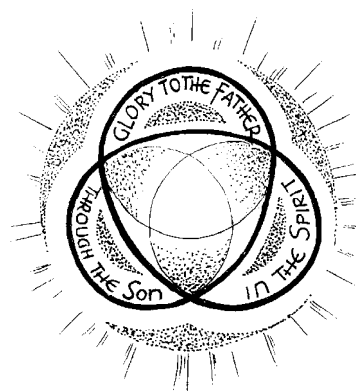

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY 3rd June 2007

Jesus was concerned that his disciples knew all that they needed to know to live their human lives to the full. He had spent three short years in their company and there was much they still needed to learn – not human knowledge but knowledge which God alone could impart. His solution to this problem was the Holy Spirit, who would be their teacher after he left them, leading them into truths about the Son of God and the new life he had been sent by the Father to bestow all who believed.

The passage today illustrates the unity and co-operation of the Trinity in our lives. The Father planned how to redeem us from sin and death, the Son assents to be the sacrifice which will achieve our freedom, and the Holy Spirit, the Helper, completes the working out in our lives of all that the Son has accomplished. The triune God wants to reveal all we need to know to live in the sure and certain knowledge of his presence with us and his eternal love.

Living in the 21st century we need all the help we can get to experience the abundant life promised by the Father and realized through the Son. It is the work of the Holy Spirit now to reveal Christ to us and enable us to be united with him in his new life. As Church we pray and earnestly seek this life which the Holy Spirit is sent to give. God does send his Spirit, we need to be open to receive him.

ROBERT BURNS: WHERE IT BEGAN is the title of a very ambitious project which starts in Maybole on June 9. It is fairly safe to say that had it not been for the market fair held in Maybole High Street in 1756 where William Burnes met and fell in love with Agnes Broun, Scotland's National Bard might never have existed. From 12 noon until 4 pm on Saturday 9 June there will be a re-enactment of the market fair where Burns' parents first met in Maybole. William will meet Agnes in the grounds of Maybole Castle and then the two will lead the public up the High Street to the Town Hall area where there will be stalls and entertainment.

In Catholic churches throughout Britain, Thursday was 'Day for Life'. What is Day for Life? The Church has a consistent and very clear message on the sacredness of human life. Day for Life is our annual celebration of this message. Its primary purpose is to foster in individual consciences, in families, in the Church and in civil society a recognition of the meaning and value of human life at every stage and every condition. The Bishops of Scotland ask that a special collection be taken at Masses this weekend to support the Linacre centre which promotes the Catholic view on bio-ethical issues and other organisations who promote this message.
