He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.

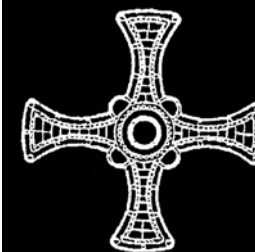

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST 10th June 2007

The passage this week is the well known miracle of the loaves and fishes. With only a little food available, Jesus feeds a crowd of 5000 and has twelve baskets of food left over. This miracle not only demonstrates his power and generosity but is a foretaste of his providing us with the Bread of Life - himself as our spiritual nourishment.

When we come together as the community of the faithful at Mass each week, we eat his body and drink his blood as a proclamation of our belief in the power of his death and resurrection. His generosity provided for us an ongoing source of nourishment the night before he gave himself totally on Calvary. In the Eucharist the past reaches out into the present, enabling the power of God to flow into our daily lives.

The Eucharist is an encounter with the Risen Christ who speaks his word today to us as powerfully as in Galilee and by the power of the Holy Spirit, called down by the priest, gives his body and blood again, in the shape of ordinary bread and wine - a miracle no less spectacular than the multiplication of the loaves and fishes to us who have faith to believe.

At Masses this weekend a Parish Directory will be distributed. Please take one. This directory is the fruit of several years of planning to encourage lay people in the parish to take on tasks and responsibilities that help build the life of the parish and ensure regular maintenance and completion of day-to-day tasks.

One of the main ideas behind the directory is that should a parishioner need information about an aspect of parish life or should they wish to point out a problem or breakage, then they can contact the person who has responsibility for that area. This helps ensure activity keeps going should the priest be unavailable — which is more and more of a reality now that this parish's priest shares his time among Maybole, St Ann's, Mossblown, Queen Margaret Academy, the Diocesan Office, and Scotus Seminary for the Training of Priests.
