THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY 7th JUNE 2009

Today we listen as Jesus gives his disciples the commission to go and spread the Good News "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit".

Belief in the Most Holy Trinity is common to all Christian denominations and is at the very core of our faith. The Trinity is a mystery but basically we believe that there are three persons in one God. All three were present at creation, and co-exist in complete love and harmony. Jesus, the Son of God, came down to our level and we can identify with him through his earthly life, death and resurrection. His sacrifice for us speaks volumes about his love, and he testifies that the Father himself loves us and indeed created us out of the abundance of that love and continues to be lavish in his care for us. The person and work of the Holy Spirit were also revealed by Jesus – he is our helper, the power of God present in us.

It is by their name that we bless ourselves, that we live and witness and it is in their divine presence that one day we will stand as the Church Triumphant.

OTHER INFORMATION AND PREPARATION

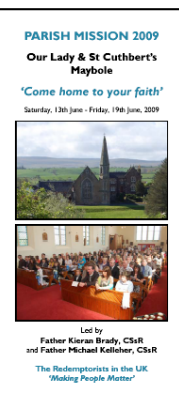

BLUETREE PLAYING AT THE ARK, AYR ON SUNDAY 14th JUNE AT 7.00 pm



After discussions with a number of people, including youth workers from local churches and particularly those involved with D-Talks, **The Ark** has approached **Bluetree** to come to Ayr to perform at **The Ark** on Sunday 14th June in association with the monthly D/Talks programme. D/Talks is a monthly youth event attended by young Christians from churches of all traditions across Ayrshire. This event is totally free and is expected to be a great night, attended by young folk from all across Scotland. People of all ages are welcome to this event.

The band's front man Aaron Boyd states: "Bluetree stands for standing out. The whole concept of that is that, if you're walking through a forest, everything you look around at is pretty much going to be green; green trees, brown branches, brown bark: you know, that kind of thing? But if you saw this tree that was bright blue and everything about it - leaves, branches, bark - was blue, it would stand out and you would stand and look at it and take notice of it. As Christians, Jesus Christ has called us to be salt, be light, in this world and really make a difference. So we want to go around and inspire kids to stand out whether that is in church or school."
