ENTRANCE PROCESSION

Awake from your slumber 154

GLORIA

FIRST READING *Exodus 24:3-8*

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. The he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.' Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. 'This' he said 'is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

SECOND READING *Hebrews 9:11-15*

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God. He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST SUNDAY 14th JUNE 2009

The night before he died Jesus had supper with his disciples. He had looked forward to celebrating this Passover meal with them, the last time he would eat and drink with them until they all met up in heaven. It was also to be the occasion when he would leave them with another kind of bread and wine consecrated by the Holy Spirit to become his own body and blood. This was what he meant when he said that anyone who ate his body and drank his blood would have eternal life.

The word we use now is "Eucharist", a thanksgiving celebration, in which we are nourished by God's word and by his body and blood – a guarantee of eternal life which begins even now on this earth. The Mass encapsulates the great mystery of the passion by re-presenting Calvary to us in our time and by providing for us, through the ministry of the priest and the power of the Holy Spirit, the great gift of Jesus himself, humbly coming to us under the form of bread and wine. We can come no nearer to the mystery of the incarnate Son of God than in the Eucharist.
